

Vincent "Buddy" Cianci, Jr. earned his Bachelor's Degree of Government from Fairfield University; his Masters of Political Science from Villanova University; and his J.D. from the Marquette University Law School. He served in the Army from 1966 – 1969 and was 1st Lieut. in the Military Police Corp. In 1969, Buddy was appointed Special Assistant Atty. General for the State of Rhode Island. He also served as prosecuter for the Organized Crime Unit until 1974 when he ran for the Mayor of Providence.

Buddy was elected Mayor six times and served the city for 21 years. During his tenure, he oversaw a revitalization of the city, known as the Capital Center Project, which included these achievements:

- Creation of Water Place Park, with the completion of the River Relocation Project
- Securing attractions to Downtown, including the Providence Place Mall and the Rhode Island Convention Center, with the adjoining Westin Hotel.
- Attracted an AHL Hockey Team, the Providence Bruins
- Restored the Providence Performing Arts Center and created an Art District

Today, he hosts his own weekday talk radio show, *The Buddy Cianci Show* on WPRO radio. Buddy is also a political commentator on WLNE ABC-6 and on the nationally syndicated *Hannity Show*.
